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Dr. Cordova is an international expert on regulatory reform and good governance issues who has advised governments of more than 30 developed or in-transition countries. In 2012, he also was in charge of a high-level training on Regulatory Governance for heads of better regulation offices of Mexican states.

He is the main developer of the *RegulatoryResultsCalculator* (*RRC*)©, an adapted Standard Cost Model measurement process that permits reformers to calculate the pre-reform baseline and the monetary outcomes of systematic licenses and permits reforms. The RRC has been deployed in Bosnia, Serbia, Montenegro Kenya (see IFC Smart Lessons, May 2009) and Tunisia (2012). He has also co-designed with a technological firm partner the Internet based software *e*RIA*, which is the first integrated software solution for systematizing the entire process of developing draft laws and other regulations through better design, RIA, stakeholder consultation, and quality control so that governments can produce higher quality, more market-friendly regulations at lower cost. He also participated in the development of the Regulatory Guillotine™ software developed in Croatia in 2007 and deployed since then in more than half a dozen countries.
